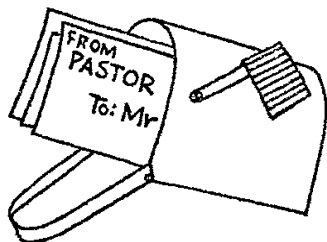

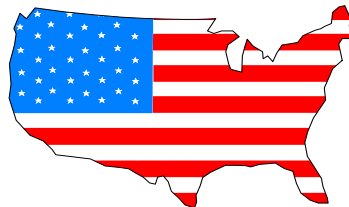

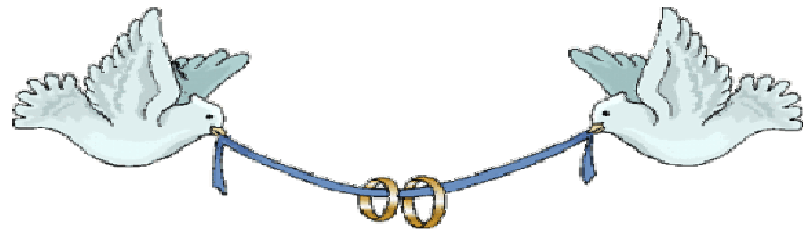

Meeting was adjourned by Linda Williams, and we ended with the Lord's Prayer.

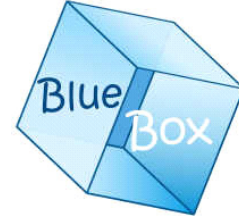

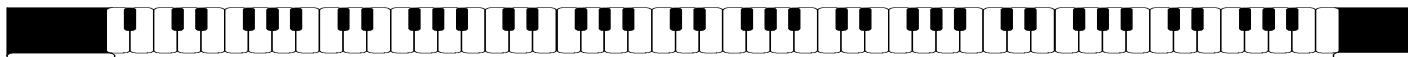
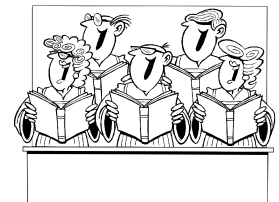

Meeting called to order at 6:06 p.m.

Jerry Husbands presented the devotion.

Minutes of the November 16 Council meeting: Motion by Diane Ziehl to approve, second by Ken Mueller, motion passed.

Treasurer's report: After discussion regarding adding an account for insurance monies received, motion by Ken Mueller to approve, second by Jerry Husbands, motion passed.

Building fund report: Ken reported he has been in contact with Mission Investment Fund regarding a modification agreement to our loan, lowering the interest rate.. Motion by Michael Wagner to approve, second by Linda Kimberling, motion passed.

Pastor's report: Thanks to the outgoing council members for a job well done. Friday is the Christmas Eve service, please pray for good weather. 2011 is the third and final year of our PMC commitment.

Christian Education: Welcome to the new members, Denise Kralina and Carolyn Durkin. Sunday School attendance is averaging 4 to 8 children. There are 5 youth in confirmation class. Adult Sunday School is averaging 3 to 5 attending. Pastor's weekday class will pick back up after the holidays. Men's Bible study is averaging 5 to 8 in attendance, had 15 last week. Women's Bible study averages 5 to 7 in attendance. High School Sunday School is studying the Book of Hope, study will continue through February. Committee discussed ways to attract more volunteers to teach, and increase attendance at Adult Sunday School.

Evangelism: Welcome to new members Carolyn Garrett and Wendy Blomberg. Several ideas for evangelism in the community were discussed. Gerry Williams will contact possible speakers for topics of interest to members and the community to put on a forum at Kent. 64 members of Kent attended the Main Street Opry on December 2. The roadside banner is up. The Kent Klowns remain busy with appearances at Laurie Care Center and the American Legion. Welcome to new Klowns Bill and Vanessa Hebrank and Chris and Cindy Sharp. Jerry Husbands is in charge of changing the message on the portable sign. A celebration of Killion's 60th anniversary will be on December 19. Donut order has been reduced, if necessary it can be increased again. Treat bags will be given to the Sunday School children following the Christmas program on December 12.

PMC: A prayer luncheon is being scheduled.

Property: No meeting, but the tractor and blade from Dennis Boos has been put to good use. December 21, 2010 Council Minutes continued

Social Ministry: They received 7 needs calls in November, and also gave \$200 to Share the Harvest for turkeys for the pantry. They gave \$200 in Save-a-lot food certificates to Community for Christ. Four people receive gasoline from Lake Oasis. The committee received notification of a \$450 donation to the Darleen Mueller fund, as well as a thank you note from Share the Harvest. Salvation Army bell ringing is going well, with most time slots filling with volunteer's names. The Loving Gifts tree party went well. The Blue Boxes are doing well also. Welcome to new members Judy Ward and Gary Esbeck.

Long-Range Planning report: Working on criteria to award the Stewart McFadden Scholarship funds, which currently has a balance of approximately \$160,000. That should convert to approximately \$1800 in scholarship money in 2011, with priority given to Kent family members. The committee is planning a new pictorial directory in April.

Youth: Seven kids and 3 adults went to Miner Mike's November 13. Kids Klub will be on December 15, will ask the Klowns to join the them. Ice skating is scheduled for December 11 in Jefferson City.

Worship and Music: No meeting

Old Business: Committee chairs are reminded that annual reports are due by January 15, 2011, and that outgoing committee members need to be replaced. Curtis and Diane Reams, and Travis Bullock have transferred their membership from Westlake Christian Church to Ken Memorial. Motion by Michael Wagner, second by Bob Harger to affirm their transfer of membership. Motion carried. Thanks to Gail Kruse for the Christmas program that he Sunday School presented on December 19 (weather postponed from December 12).

New business: Election of new officers for 2011: Michael Wagner nominated for president, Chuck Wanamaker nominated for Vice-President. Motion made that nominations cease. Motion carried. Motion by Ken Mueller to appoint Toni Wagner as Recording Secretary, Gail Kruse as Treasurer, Jean Killion as Financial Secretary, Ken Gerardy as Building Fund Treasurer and Barb Patterson as Building Fund Secretary, second by Gary Wiles, motion carried. Motion by Michael Wagner to pay Christmas bonus to paid Kent Memorial staff (Kathleen Marco, Jan Ellis, Tracy Garrett and Jennifer Bolton), second by Ken Mueller, motion carried. A request has been received from American Insurance, our new neighbor to the north, to be allowed to install a 5 foot by 8 foot sign on church property in front of their building. Property committee will research the logistics, and what kind of lease would be needed in the event permission was granted. Several members have mentioned that they would like to see Holy Communion offered at both services each Sunday. This will discussed further at the next meeting.

PARTNERSHIP FOR THE MISSIONAL CHURCH PROMOTES PRAYER PROJECT

In order to set the stage for the next project of Partnership for a Missional Church, Pastor Beese gave permission to use his explanation of the activities since the beginning of this mission.

This is our third and final year as we partner with 14 other ELCA congregations dwelling in the Word and discovering God already at work in our communities. During our first year in this process, we learned more about ourselves and how God has been at work the last 60 years at Kent Memorial. The second year was spent discovering what our new mission outreach was going to be. Where was God already working and who could we partner with in our community. With the help of the council and the congregation we discovered our missional challenge:

Youth being the future of the community, how can we discover and respond to their many challenges?

Last summer and fall we began working with Hurricane Deck School in Camden County and South School in Morgan County. We asked them this question, how can we help you help your children? Now we are building a relationship of trust with the teachers and staff of these two schools.

Hosting a meal for the entire staff at each school was the beginning of the partnership with PMC. While visiting with the staff they responded to our question. One staff member at South School said there was a great need for winter coats. WELCA donated the money for 15 coats which were delivered last fall. Another staff member at Hurricane Deck asked if we could pray for them.

The PMC Prayer Project will begin on January 23, 2011. Recently, cutout handprints for each staff member were delivered to both schools. Staff members were given the opportunity to sign their name to the cutout and add a prayer request. These handprint cutouts are now part of the "Hand to Hand in Prayer" poster.

The PMC committee now presents an opportunity to the congregation. Hearts with a staff member's name and a prayer request are available. We encourage you to be part of this prayer project and take a heart home. Place the heart in a prominent place and pray for the individual. In three weeks, on Sunday, February 13th return the heart to church. You are encouraged to sign your name, write a little note or include a card. The PMC committee will return the hearts with some feedback from congregation members. Just think what God can do with so many of us praying.
