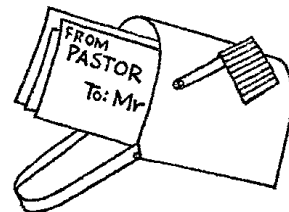

From the Desk of **Pastor Dave** ~

Spring has sprung, so they say. Yesterday, I mowed my lawn for the first time. It was great to be outside without a jacket and soak up all that sun. I really love the longer days. This morning I fertilized the lawn, hopefully keeping all that crab grass out of the lawn this year. It's nice to have good neighbors. My spreader wasn't working too well, so I borrowed Jerry Husbands' and got the job finished in no time.



Did you know that the word for Lent means spring (the lengthening of days). In the early church Lent was a time of baptismal renewal. Some may recall a time when Lent was primarily a season of penitence and sorrow. Lent certainly is a time for self-examination, which leads us all to sorrow and repentance. But when separated from the search for baptismal identity, this can be viewed as too individual.

Lent should constantly invite believers to consider what baptismal living means and how being baptized radically changes everything. Lent, then, is not a season of sorrow or forced sadness, but a time of growth, enabled both by individual and communal discernment as we discover for ourselves where the Holy Spirit is calling us to be part of God's mission in the world.

Baptism is not just an event that happened years ago when a pastor poured water over our heads. Baptism is a daily journey with God where we continually seek God's guidance and strength.

All this leads up to what we as a congregation are doing on Sunday, April 10 after the 10:30 worship service. As part of the process for the missional church we are going to ask, "Lord, where are you leading Kent Memorial? What is it that you are asking us to focus our attention on for the next three to five years?"

We begin with a meal prepared by our PMC Steering Team and then, I believe the next two hours will be interesting, fun and Spirit led. I'm counting on YOU to be present and enjoy the process with us. After all, isn't that what it means to be the church, together?

To get us ready for that process four of our members will enter the pulpit on April 3rd and 10th and explain what the 8 patterns of a "Missional" congregation look like. May you have a blessed, insightful and meaningful Lenten season as we prepare ourselves for the Easter Feast on April 24.

MEETING MINUTES, MARCH 1, 2011

Twenty-six members attended the March 1, 2011 WELCA meeting at Kent Memorial Lutheran Church. President Eldeen Hanke opened the meeting with two prayers. She then asked Karen Pragman to introduce our speaker, Joy Dickman, a volunteer coordinator from the Camdenton school district who spoke about ways we, either as a church or individually, could get involved in helping at Hurricane Deck elementary school. She spoke about:

- The “Looking Good” program
- “Buddy Packs” - food for the weekend
- Various jobs in school that were for volunteers

She handed out informational brochures, and invited us to volunteer. This is a good starting point for the congregation in the PMC vision for the community.

There were no visitors.

Eldeen thanked Shirley Clark and Jan Ellis for the dessert.

Melba Bangert gave the devotions based on “popular versus powerful” in our life (credentials vs. concerns).

Nancy Beese read the minutes for both the November and January meetings. They were approved as read.

Treasurer’s reports for December, January and February were on the tables for perusal in Karen Hardwick’s absence. There were no questions, and reports were approved as presented.

Eldeen reported that the Area Nine Spring Cluster for the ELCA (not WELCA) will be held at Kent on March 13th, and sent around sign-up sheets for members to bring food.

There will be a St. Patrick’s Day party at the Care Center after the parade, and all are invited. There also will be a Spring Decoration sale, and all are invited to attend that, as well. 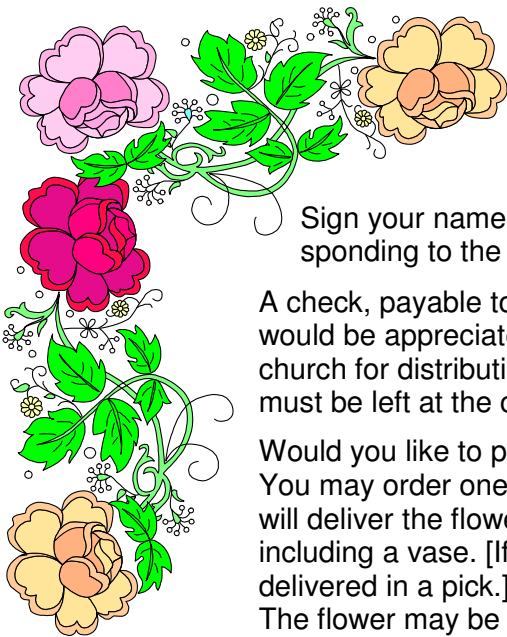

ALTAR FLOWERS

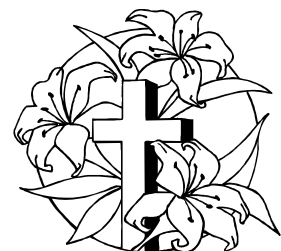
Celebrate a special person or event by placing flowers on the altar. A chart for this purpose is located on the bulletin board in the Gathering Room.

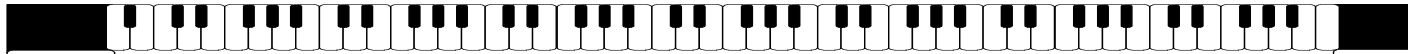

Meeting called to order at 6:05 p.m.

Pastor Beese presented the devotion.

Motion by Chuck Wanamaker to approve the Treasurer's report as presented, second by Jerry Husbands, motion carried.

Motion by Gail Kruse to approve the Building Fund report as presented, second by Linda Kimberling, motion carried.

Motion by Linda Kimberling to approve the minutes from the February council meeting, second by Ken Gerardy, motion carried.

Pastor's report: *Update on Bill Hunter's condition. *Pastor shared information regarding Thrivent policyholders ChoiceDollars. Policyholders can designate a Lutheran organization as recipient of their dividends paid (ChoiceDollars), and some members of KMLC who are Thrivent policyholders have chosen to have their ChoiceDollars sent to KMLC. Council will decide at the end of each year how ChoiceDollars received will be allocated, based on needs within the congregation, for example Social Ministry, Youth, etc., unless the policyholder has already made a specific request. *The Area Ministry IX Spring meeting was held at KMLC on Sunday, March 13. The Area Ministry IX is asking member churches to participate in an exercise to help determine how their individual congregations are doing in regard to four Missional Directions identified by the Area IX leaders.

Available committee reports were presented.

Old Business: *A request for persons interested in being KMLC delegates to the Synod Assembly in June will be put in the bulletins and newsletter. *Council members participated in PMC Visioning, by closing their eyes and envisioning what KMLC will look like in 5 years, then sharing their visions with the rest of the council members.

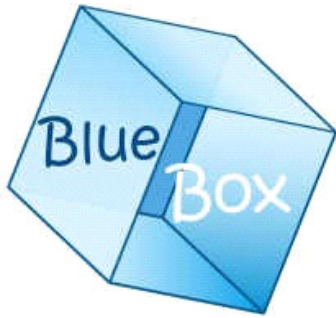

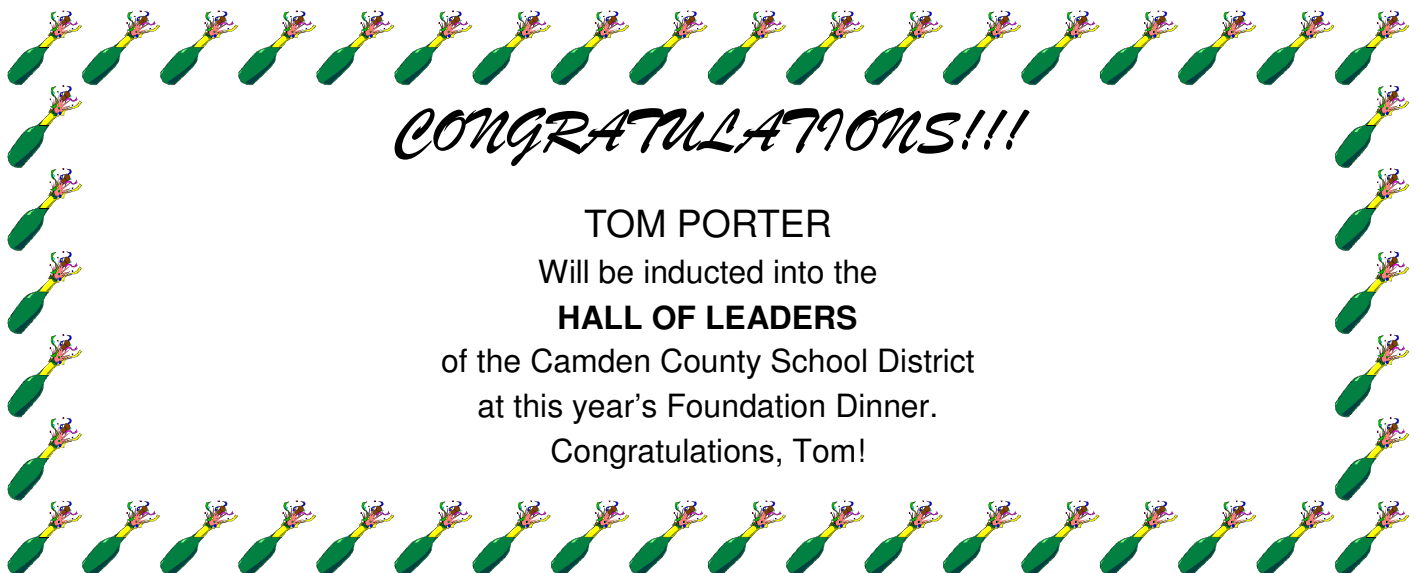

EIGHT MISSIONAL PATTERNS CONGREGATIONAL EVENT

APRIL 10, 2011

The Partners for a Missional Church Committee has reason to rejoice this spring. The day for which we have diligently prepared is about to arrive. April 10, 2011 is the selected date to present, discuss and decide from among “eight missional patterns” what the goals for the future missions of Kent will become. The past two years we have learned these truths:

We are about God’s work
We are lead by God
We are centered on Christ
The Spirit is with us
Prayer is essential
The results are God’s
It is our work to do

The work will begin immediately following the 10:30 am Worship Service. We will convene in Fellowship Hall for a light meal followed by opening prayer, Dwelling in the Word, and the introduction to the process. The congregation will break out into four small discussion groups lead by trained leaders. Each group will be assigned two of the pre-determined missional church patterns. They will learn about that pattern from the discussion leader, discuss that pattern, and rate its relative role as it exists in the life of Kent Memorial. The patterns are recognizable, some may already be in place, and can be recognized as gifts from God. The focus will be on building strengths rather than working on weaknesses. The concept of a Missional Church is not seen as being totally in the community at large, but includes what happens within congregational walls, whether we are gathered for worship, or encouraging and supporting others in Christian life. After the small group determination is completed, the congregation will come together again to listen to the small group reports, discuss the findings, and through prayer and discernment, make a final rating of each of the eight patterns.

The purpose and over-all goal of the discussions will be to discover and identify Kent’s God-given strengths and gifts and determine which two or three of the eight patterns should become the long-range plan for the next three to five years. Missional churches are willing to take risks because they have spent time together in prayer and are confident about the direction the Holy Spirit is leading them.

The eight missional patterns are described as:

1. Missional Vocation
2. Biblical Formation & Discipleship
3. Taking Risks as a Contrast Community
4. Practices That Demonstrate God’s Intent for the World
5. Worship as Public Witnesses
6. Dependence on the Holy Spirit
7. Journeying Toward the Reign of God
8. Missional Authority

You will be hearing more on April 3 and 10, at each worship service, about what the eight missional patterns are and how they might be used to benefit our church life together. Give thanks to God for this important event which is about to take place.

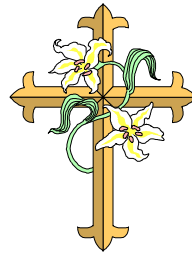

HOLY WEEK

Maundy Thursday Service, April 21, at 7:00 p.m. ~ Communion will be celebrated

Good Friday Tenebrae Service, April 22, at 7:00 p.m. — *Tenebrae* is the Latin for *shadows* or *darkness*. In the fourth century a solemn observance of our Lord's death on the cross, known as "Tenebrae" was celebrated. The service involved the lighting and extinguishing of candles as a remind of the darkness that covered the earth after the passion and crucifixion of our Savior.
