PASTOR'S CORNER --

How Long is the Easter Season?

Lloyd Oglivie, former pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Hollywood, California, tells of meeting two young men after an Easter worship service. They had remained free from drugs for over a year after a decisive encounter with the Risen Christ.

They hailed the pastor with “*Hey, man, thanks for the Easter fix!*” The other man contradicted his friend: “*You’re wrong. We didn’t get a fix, we got hooked up for intravenous feeding from the Man. We’re mainlining it on the Lord himself!*”

They all laughed. Oglivie appreciated their street jargon effort to express what the Easter celebration had meant to them.

The pastor concludes: “*There’s a difference between an Easter fix and a constant flow of Easter power to really get us fixed up.*”

I do wonder about people who only come to church on Easter. I have a hunch they get some comfort to hear that their sin is forgiven through the cross and feel some vague relief from their panic about death because Christ was raised from the dead. But what’s missing from a brief experience of the Easter joy is an on-going and liberating aspect of the Christian faith. It’s possible to become an Easter person and enjoy God every day!

St. Paul wanted the Christians in Asia Minor to understand that God had resurrected them from among the living dead and made them truly alive. He longed for them to be sure they were the living among the dead, rather than the dead among the living.

Our resurrection is not simply a refinement of old talents and abilities, but a new creation; not just a different attitude, but a new spirit, the spirit of Jesus himself. Out of the grave of our depleted efforts, the Lord gives us a fresh vision, insight and answers we had not conceived of before. For resurrection living there is resurrection power.

This is an on-going Easter, not a temporary fix. This is living and enjoying God for a lifetime and into eternity!!

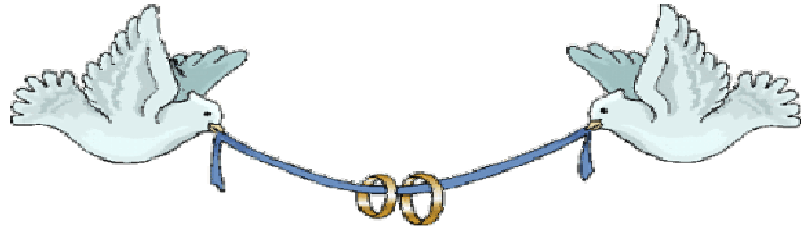

Thirty-two members attended the April 5th, 2011, WELCA meeting at Kent Memorial Lutheran Church. President Eldeen Hanke opened the meeting with a prayer, and thanked our hostesses Evelyn Clements and Cheryl Boos.

Sharon Ballard gave a devotion entitled "Joy".

Secretary Nancy Beese read the minutes of the previous meeting, and they were approved as read. Eldeen gave changes and updates on the WELCA directory for those who just received one.

Karen Hardwick gave the treasurer's report, and it was approved as presented.

Christian Action - Shirley Clark reported 12 ladies working, 10 sets of hats and booties (made by Linda Williams) and 86 animals were ready to take to the hospital.

Community For Christ - Melba reported that the Spring Give Away will be April 9th, and the Change-Over will be April 11th. Those working the Change-Over should be there at 9:00 a.m. Kent's next times to work will be April 19, 21 and 23.

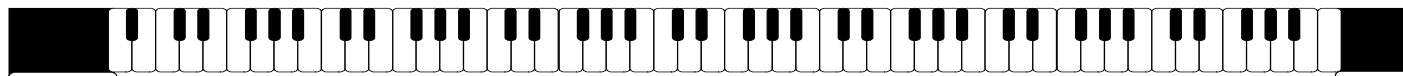
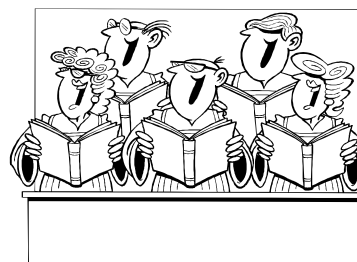

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by President, Michael Wagner

Pastor led the council in Dwelling in the Word, using the passage from Acts 6: 1-7

A motion was made by Ken Gerardy and seconded by Gary Wiles to approve the minutes of the March 15 council meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Linda Kimberling and seconded by Denise Kralina to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Gail Kruse and seconded by Jerry Husbands to approve the Building Fund report. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: Pastor shared the Holy Week/Easter schedule which includes: Maundy Thursday service; Good Friday Tenebrae Service in which the pastors from Ozark Chapel United Methodist Church and West Lake Christian church will participate; On Easter Saturday morning there will be a rehearsal for the outdoor Pageant and a time to set up the Easter Garden in the Gathering Place; Easter Sunday will include a Sunrise Service at 6:30, Breakfast at 7:30, Easter Pageant at 8:30, Egg Hunt at 10:00 and Festival Worship at 10:30. * The backdrop for the Easter Pageant was assembled and put into place by volunteers from Kent and West Lake Christian Church. * The request by American Insurance Company to erect a sign on Kent's property has been put on hold. * Plans for a Community Vacation Bible School are still pending. The space that has been provided by Lake West Christian Academy will be needed for summer school this year. Alternate dates and locations are being explored. * Pastor read a letter from Central States Synod Bishop Gerald Mansholt thanking Kent Congregation its partnership in ministry and its generous mission support.

Written committee reports were presented. Some dates to remember were noted. The Christian Education Committee announced a new Adult Bible Study series beginning on May 1st. On May 15th the Social Ministry Committee will be sponsoring a Ministry Fair featuring a speaker from Citizens Against Domestic Violence and a brief video on the work of the ELCA World Hunger Program. The Youth will be having a car wash on June 18th to raise funds for the ELCA Youth Gathering in 2012.

Old Business: * Synod Assembly – Ann Say has agreed to be the lay female voting member (delegate). The lay male slot is still vacant. * PMC Missional Patterns Event – On April 3 and 10 the sermon time was used to introduce the eight Missional patterns. Forty five people attended the April 10th afternoon gathering to process questions related to the patterns and select three that best reflect the ministry of Kent Memorial. These three patterns will be used to help in formulating a long range missional plan for the congregation. The next cluster event for the PMC team is May 6-7.

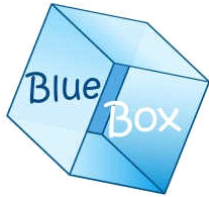
Correspondence - Thank you notes were received from the Westside Senior Center and Citizens Against Domestic Violence.

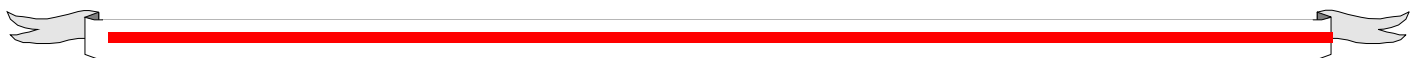

Eight Missional Patterns Congregational Event

The Partnership for a Missional Church committee greatly appreciates the response of Kent members to their invitation to participate in the Eight Missional Patterns Congregational Event held on April 10. The purpose of this event was to discover and identify Kent's God-given strengths and gifts and determine which two or three of the eight missional patterns God is calling this congregation to focus on as we plan for the next three to five years.

At our last cluster event in St. Louis, the PMC committee learned that 20% of a congregation's average worship attendance is the normal attendance pattern for this particular event. The average attendance at Kent is approximately 136. Using that formula we could have expected 27 participants. Kent Memorial again responded with great enthusiasm and support as 52 members were in attendance.

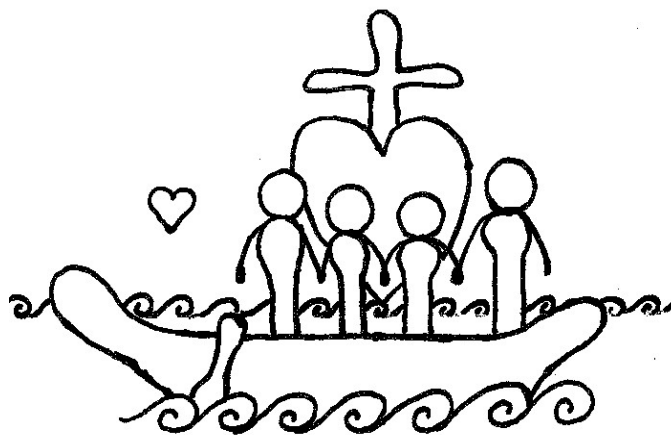
At the end of our event on April 10, the following three patterns emerged as our strengths:

Pattern #4 "Practices that Demonstrate God's Intent for the World", which is evidenced by caring, reconciliation, hospitality, involvement, and reaching out to the community.

Pattern #7 "Journeying Toward the Reign of God", in which we understand our calling as a witness to the Gospel in our broken world and strive to be a living example of what God intends for our world.

Pattern #8 "Missional Authority" which reflects the way our core lay leaders urge us to participate in God's mission in the world.

During this congregational event many positive and motivating feelings surfaced about our congregation's ministry and our capacity to carry it out. We thank God for the strengths we have identified and defined so that they may be used more effectively to better share the Gospel message.

NEW PICTORIAL DIRECTORY

PHOTOGRAPHS FOR DIRECTORY IN EARLY JUNE



The idea of an in-house pictorial directory was first suggested at a council meeting in late 2010. The Long Range Planning Committee began investigating this possibility in the early months of 2011. A directory in the form of a spiral notebook allows pages to be added or deleted as needed. After investigating the in-house directory, the LRP Committee discovered the expenses involved. Spiral notebooks for each family unit would need to be purchased, as well as ink and paper for printing. And there was the time involved in putting it together.

Olan Mills has completed the directory for Kent in past years. Realizing that a directory printed by Olan Mills would eliminate any costs to members, the LRP Committee voted to contact the company. STEWART-MCFADEN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

May 2011, five years after the establishment of the Stewart-McFaden Scholarship Fund, marks the beginning of the distribution phase. In accordance with the guidelines set forth in the will of Clifford Stewart, the earnings each year are to be awarded in scholarships to graduating seniors with some preference given to students from Kent Memorial Lutheran Church.

Clifford Stewart was a member of Kent Memorial from 1978 until his death on July 9, 2005. He was born in 1925 in Kansas City, Kansas, and graduated high school in St. Louis, Missouri. He received a Masters Degree in Psychology from the University of Missouri in Columbia. He obtained a position as a school psychologist and guidance counselor at Boces Potsdam in Norwood, New York, and spent his entire professional career there. In 1972, Cliff returned to Camdenton, following the death of his father. He cared for his aging mother, Mildred, until her death and wished to honor her by adding her maiden name, McFaden, to the scholarship fund as well as his.

Cliff enjoyed music of all kinds, classical organ music in particular. While a member of Kent Memorial, he made a significant contribution to fund the previous organ. He understood and enjoyed working with electronics and volunteered his time in the sound booth on Sunday mornings. A birth injury left Cliff with cerebral palsy inhibiting his mobility and, in his later years, speech as well.

Cliff had no immediate family and designated Don and Gloria Peterson as executors of his will. It was his wish that the total amount of his estate be placed into the scholarship fund. After undergoing all the necessary legal proceedings, the Stewart-McFaden Scholarship Fund was established with the ELCA Foundation, where it is being administered. New donations may be added to the fund at any time.

The total amount available to be awarded this year is \$1,500. There were seventeen applications received and carefully reviewed from Camdenton, Versailles, and the West Lake Christian Academy. Two Camdenton High School students were selected: Zoe Bibbes from Kent Memorial will receive \$1,000 and Jazzeaka Booker, \$500.
