FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK. . .

Dear Friends in Christ,

Jesus led the way in being loving, but his love had a distinctively different quality of strength to it. In his own life that meant not the shedding of other's blood in order to make peace but the shedding of his own. That's why people questioned his sanity. For Jesus love meant being sensitive to the poor and downtrodden and those who didn't count and calling them his sisters and brothers.

"Here are my mother and my brothers!" Jesus said. (Mark 3:34-35) Whoever prizes human worth more than the traditions of the law is my family. Whoever seeks to forgive others as they have been forgiven by God is my family. Whoever risks with grace instead of playing it safe with rules and regulations is my family. "Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

They thought Jesus was mad because he challenged the popular and comfortable assumptions of the world and society. He laid his life on the line for his overwhelming love for others. He stood up to any powers, authority or social conventions which acted as a barrier to human fulfillment of God's purposes.

And think of us. Are we called to live sanely and placidly, not challenging the way of the world, or are we called to something different? Are we really crazy enough to follow the Christ? Maybe that's the wrong question. Is God's love great enough to embrace even the likes of you and me - our apathy, our reluctance, our fears, our flaws? And if we are crazy enough to believe that, then it is with joy that Jesus says of us, You are my family!

WELCA MINUTES JULY 5, 2011

Twenty-five members and one guest (Joyce Wanamaker's neighbor) attended the July 5th WELCA meeting at Kent Memorial Lutheran Church. President Eldeen Hanke introduced Joyce Chorpeneing, the volunteer coordinator from Laurie Care Center. She shared the history of Laurie Care Center, and also a history of her volunteer involvement. She then explained that the state now requires all volunteers to have passed an EDL (Employee Disqualification List) by taking a one hour orientation class at Laurie Care. The EDL employs a background checklist to qualify or disqualify the potential volunteer. This helps secure a safe environment for all residents. This volunteer training must be taken by the end of the year. She asked people to call to set up a time to take this orientation. There will be several class times available. If one is at the nursing home in several capacities (visiting, bingo, church service, etc.) they need to take this orientation.

Eldeen then thanked hostesses Joyce Wanamaker, with the help of Shirley and Lester Clark and Jan Ellis.

Barb Yount gave a devotion entitled "Everything I Need to Know, I Learned From Noah's Ark".

The secretary read the minutes of the June meeting, and they were approved as read.

Treasurer Karen Hardwick reported a June balance of \$2,774.21. The treasurer's report was approved as given.

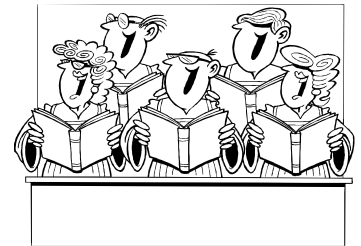

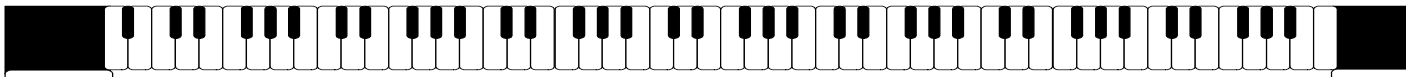

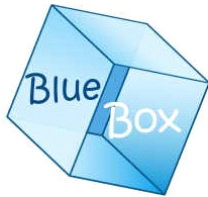
