From The Pastor's Desk

During the months of January and February we will be worshipping at 9:30 am. Please mark this on your calendar and in your mind. On the 1st, 3rd and 5th Sundays our style of worship will be more liturgical and on the 2nd and 4th Sundays we'll be informal. Communion will be celebrated every Sunday.

This change will give our congregational members a chance to get more acquainted with one another and worship with a fuller voice as many of our friends head south for the winter. The 9:30 a.m. time was chosen to make a more even split between 8:00 and 10:30. As your Pastor, I ask that you support this worship change with your enthusiasm and attendance -- our Lord expects that from us. Make a JOYFUL NOISE unto the Lord! We will return to our normal worship schedule in March.

Start warming up for Advent to be hot for Christmas

A foreman in a brass foundry was guiding a new employee on a tour of the plant. They came into an area where molten metal was being poured into huge crucibles. The crucibles were made of a translucent material which glowed like fire when hot. The foreman took a heavy sledge hammer and, holding it in both hands, delivered a powerful blow against one of the empty but still hot crucibles. Again and again he struck, but he could do no more than make tiny dents in the huge container. Then he picked up a small hammer and approached a crucible that had been completely cooled off. With a short motion of the wrist, he tapped the cool crucible and shattered it. "Nothing can break one of the crucibles when they're hot," he explained, "but anything can break them when they're cold." Then taking on the role of philosopher, he added, "it's pretty hard to break a person whose spirit is hot, but even little things will break a person wide open when their spirit grows cold."

Christmas is a time of great joy! For God remembers his Covenant and the savior promised from the earliest of days is given anew. The season of Advent offers time to prepare for the journey to Bethlehem and to prepare your heart to receive God's unexpected and undeserved gift.

As your pastor, I invite you to make the journey to Bethlehem so that you may keep your spirit hot. Join us every Sunday morning and Wednesday evening as we prepare for greatest of all gifts - that of Jesus Christ. Receive him into your hearts this Christmas and I guarantee that nothing will be able to break you.

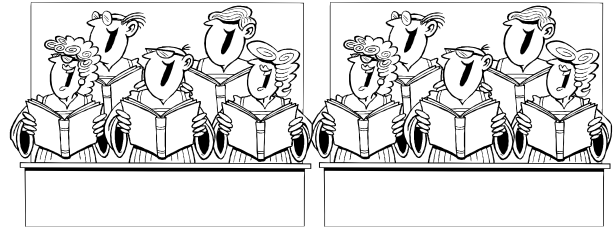

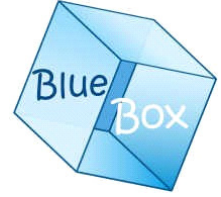

Remember, 90% of what is donated stays in our area.

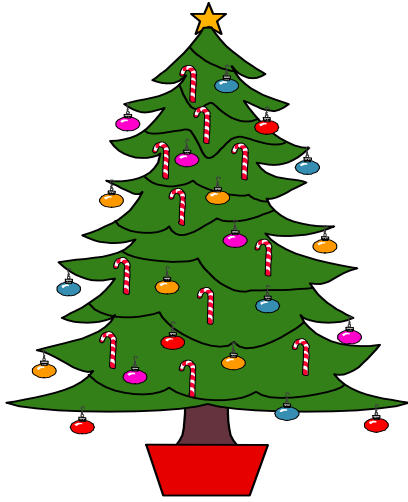

LOVING GIFTS TREE

It is hard to think of Christmas when we are still feeling the Fall season outside, but it will be here before we know it. The Social Ministry team will again be putting up a Loving Gifts Tree this year. There are a couple of changes that you should note:



1. We are devoting all our efforts this year to our local organization, CADV (Citizens Against Domestic Violence). Their needs are great and grow with each year and the hard economic times. Last year there were 60 Mothers and 112 Children that needed help. This help consists of them leaving their homes at a moment's notice and leaving "ALL" behind. They are then transported to a safe house to start their lives again without abuse. Their journey from that day forward involves getting employment, a car, and a new safe place to live. So you can see that their needs are many. This last year they have had to turn women and children away because they do not have enough room to shelter them. We are asking that you will open your hearts to CADV families.

2. The second change is that we are going to try a mix on our tree of children and moms. We will have approximately 40 Children and 20 Moms for you to choose from the tree. We know that you all enjoy buying gifts for the children, but we hope that some of you will consider a mother this year. She might need things like housekeeping items or maybe a luxury

item like perfume or clothing.

Remember that their lists are only a guideline to help you in your shopping. You do not have to get all items on the list. This is entirely up to you and your budget. We will be getting the names approximately the first week of November and will have the tree up as soon as possible after we get those names. So watch the bulletin for information and watch for the tree decorated with tags. (A little note about the tags: They will not have pictures and the names are fictitious. This is to protect them from their former situations.) When you are putting your packages together or anytime this Christmas Season, prayers for their future life are also a wonderful gift.
